

# **Native Plant Society of Texas**

## **Ann Miller Gonzalez Research Grants for Graduate Students**

**The Native Plant Society of Texas (NPSOT) will award research grants to university graduate students for academic research related to Texas native plants and/or to conservation and restoration of native-plant habitats of Texas.**

### **Awards**

The NPSOT graduate-research grant award will be up to \$2000 for the duration of the grantee's research project. One graduate-research grant may be awarded per year, if funding is available.

### **Administration**

General administration of the NPSOT Research Grants Program is under the direction of the NPSOT Research Grants Committee composed of the Vice-President of Education (chair) and three members of NPSOT. This committee will screen all applications and select the recipient. Final approval of the selected applicant will be made by vote of the NPSOT State Officers.

### **Qualifications**

Applicant must be enrolled in a graduate program in biology, botany, horticulture, landscape design, or related field at an accredited university or college and be pursuing research related to Texas native plants and/or to conservation and restoration of native-plant habitats of Texas.

### **Follow-Up**

Within 30 days after completion of the research project for which this grant is awarded, the grantee should submit a written report describing the results of the research. A copy of the student's thesis or a research paper published in a scientific journal will satisfy this requirement.

### **Application**

Application for the NPSOT research grant is made by sending:

- 1) a *completed application form*,
- 2) one copy of the current *official (with seal) college transcripts for each school attended* (record of the last college semester should be on the transcript), and
- 3) one *letter of recommendation* from the professor supervising the applicant's research project (letter should address applicant's scholastic and research abilities as well as significance of the applicant's research project).

### **Deadline**

Completed application with all transcripts and letter of recommendation must be received by NPSOT by **January 15**. The successful applicant will be notified by April 1 of the year of application.
