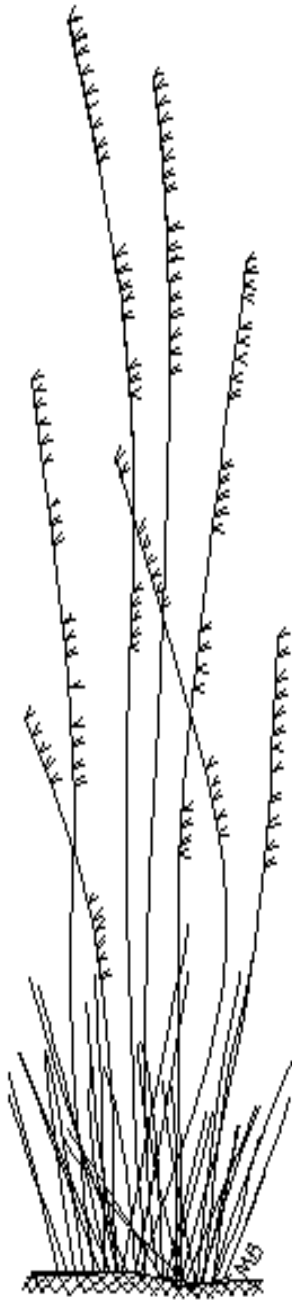

Happy Spring Native Plant Lovers!

The Redbud and Mexican Plum trees are welcoming spring into our area, while under story coralberry and American beautyberry bushes are sporting fresh, bright-green leaves. Salvias, echinaceas, pavonia, and penstemons are all starting to sprout or are sending out new leaves. Bees, spiders, and a few butterflies are all appearing in my garden daily now. I am enjoying watching my plants come up and relish the thought of putting in a few more!
