Texas Native Wildflower Seed Mix



The seeds were purchased from Native American Seed at www.seedsource.com/ in Junction, Texas. We packaged them with enough seeds to cover a 20 square foot area with full sun exposure (5+ hours of direct sunlight per day is ideal, but less will work). Below is a list of wildflowers in the mix.

Contains:

- American Basket Flower
- Browneyed Susan
- Butterfly Milkweed
- Cutleaf (Engelmann) Daisy
- Illinois Bundleflower
- Indian Blanket
- Lanceleaf Coreopsis
- Plains Coreopsis
- Tickseed Coreopsis (Golden-Wave)
- Lemon Horsemint
- Partridge Pea
- Purple Coneflower
- Purple Prairie Clover
- White Prairie Clover

How to plant:

- Best time to plant is in the fall, September through November
- If they cannot be planted in the fall then it is best to plant from December through April
- Scarify surface (no tilling, just rough the surface so the seeds will have good contact with the soil)
- Scatter the seed by hand sowing (no seed preparation is needed, seed is ready to be sowed)
- Walk on the area with flat soled shoes
- Lightly water (no runoff or the seed will wash away)

Maintenance:

- Do not use fertilizer, pesticides, or herbicides near the area
- No watering needed if planted in September through February unless it is extremely dry (careful to not over water)
- If planted from February through April water the first three weeks about every four to five days unless it rains, then wait until the soil dries and start the watering cycle over
- After established, no maintenance needed except to remove unwanted plants and water during dry periods (careful to not over water)
